

Author Guidelines for the preparation and submission of Extended Abstract

All submitted extended abstracts should report original and previously unpublished research results. The language of the manuscript would be English (Use American or British standard, but not a mixture of both). All Non-English terms and technical terms should be in italicized. All abbreviations should be written in full at the first time of appearance. SI units should be used.

Please send your full paper via email address <u>nsa2021@esn.ac.lk</u> and mention 'Extended Abstract submission' in the subject line.

Manuscript Format

The content of the extended abstract should be structured as follows:

Title page:	Title, author/s name/s and address (institutional affiliations)
Abstract: Keywords: Introduction: Materials and Methods: Results, Discussion and Conclusion/s:	Maximum of 250 words Maximum of 5 keywords Maximum of 350 words Maximum of 350 words Maximum of 800 words
References:	(Only one table or figure could be included in this section.)Maximum of five key references could be included.

Page setting format

Font:	Times New Roman
Font size:	12
Line spacing:	Double
Text alignment:	Justify
Margins:	3.75 cm wide left side and 2.5 cm wide top, bottom and right side

1. All pages should be numbered sequentially using Arabic numerals at the bottom center.

- 2. Submit your paper as an electronic file written only in a Microsoft Word document (DOC, DOCX).
- 3. Title (Upper case, Font- Times New Roman, 14 pt, Bold, Center alignment)
- 4. **Sub-Title** (Font- Times New Roman, 12 pt, Italic) It should be described with sufficient detail of the contents.
- 5. Acknowledgments (Upper case, Font- Times New Roman, 13 pt, Bold, Center alignment) All acknowledgments (if any) should be included at the very end of the paper before the references and may include supporting grants, presentations, and so forth.
- 6. **Reference** (Upper case, Font- Times New Roman, 13 pt, Bold, Center alignment)

Reference should be prepared using Harvard-style. Examples:

7. Tables and Figures (Times New Roman, 12 pt, Bold, Capitalize Each World)

Tables should be numbered sequentially using Arabic numbers. The titles should be self-explanatory and placed above the Tables. Tables should not contain any vertical lines.

Figures should be numbered sequentially using Arabic numbers and be accompanied with a self-explanatory caption placed below the Figure
